

# The First Community at the Stimate

REFLECTION




NOV. CORNELIS, INDO: "No pain there is no gain". Perhaps this is a good expression to describe how Fr. Gaspar and his companions struggled to establish a new congregation and started a new life to live together as a community. At the beginning of establishment, of course there were so many difficulties and challenges faced by the founder and His companions but because their strong belief in the power of God and strong willingness, which guided them to establish the congregation. By their enthusiasm, they kept going despite the problems of the unsafe atmosphere of the country because of the war at that time. The main purpose of establishing the congregation is to help those people who were suffering, the marginalized and persecuted especially the young. Despite limitations the and shortcomings they have had, they were always trying to give the best service they could do. This story should be a lesson or reflection for us as followers of St. Gaspar and members of this congregation. Although our problems and difficulties are various but we must learn how to solve them. To achieve everything that we want

is not easy. Our congregation can continue on and develop until this time not without struggle and suffering. Therefore, we should be grateful to those who dedicate their lives to developing this congregation such as our priests and missionaries. We as the successors, hopes and future of the congregation, in our hands, there is the responsibility to continue the work and ideals of the congregation. We must realize that without willingness and hard work we will get nothing. Always remember that all great things always start from the small ones. If we want to run, we must learn how to work first. If we want to swim, we must learn how to float first. Don't give up when faced with adversity, think of it as a challenge to try even harder. Don't ask what the Congregation can give to us but what we will give to the congregation. Let us join our hands and walk together to build up our congregation for now and for the future.

**NOV. JOMON, IND:** The first community of Stimate was opened on November 4, 1816. In the beginning there were only four members in the community. They lived together in the community. They shared everything in common. They did not do anything for themselves but they did everything for the glory of God. They were less in numbers but they could do many things as a community. As the followers of Saint Gaspar Bertoni let us try our best to make our community as the first community of Stimate. Let us not seek for the personal glories instead let us try to do everything for the glory of God.

**NOV. CRIZALDY, PHIL:** The first is always been the hardest. This saying was an undeniable reality for the courageous pioneers of the Stigmatines. They had a tough and humble beginning, such as, the time of the French Revolution and the small number of their members. However, with zealous hearts and fraternal love, these circumstances did not stop them in performing their ministry and in building their community. This serves as an inspiration for us as future Stigmatines. We must always remember that a community is not only built by metals and bricks but also bounded by joyful



spirit and brotherly love; not only resided by superiors and confreres but also occupied by harmony and prosperity. Thus, building a community out of love is also building an earthly kingdom of God.

NOV. SONET, IND: The first community of Stimate was initiated by St. Gaspar was on a divine call of God. St. Gaspar took eight years to discern the divine call. Therefore it is not a human intention but God's. At the proper time, on November 4, 1816, St. Gaspar begins his community at the chapel of the Stigmata of St. Francis in Verona. Fr. Gaspar, Fr. Giovani Maria Marani, Bro. Paulo Zanoli were the first members of the community and later on joined by Fr. Michelangelo Gramego. They were called as the 'four cats'. Even though they were least in number they lived a good model of religious life. They lead their life according to the Word of God and kept obedience, poverty and chastity towards God with great humbleness. They never complained or became discouraged in their nothingness but trusted in the providence of God. They used whatever they had for the glory of the God. At the beginning their ministry was to teach morals and Christian teachings to children who were abandoned and affected by

war. They used their chapel and the rooms for that purpose. St. Gaspar had no worries about the future of congregation because he had great faith that the congregation belongs to God and God himself is the founder. Therefore He will lead His congregation according to His will. Then St. Gaspar teaches his disciples about the Holy abandonment and trust in the providence of God. St. Gaspar entrusted his congregation to the Holy Spouses and those who like to join this congregation have to study from them and totally entrust themselves to their care and protection.

NOV. TOM, IND: God calls everyone to serve him. "So whatever you eat or drink or whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God." (1Cor.10:31) Love for God and the search for His glory is the meaning of community life. The main goal of religious life is to foster and support community life. Thus every work of religious must be done through love. The first Stigmatine community members were Fr. Gaspar Bertoni, Fr. Giovanni Maria Marani and Bro. Zanoli. Later Fr. Michelangelo Gramego also joined with them. In the beginning they faced a lot of difficulties. They had deep faith in God. They lived poor and self-sacrificing style of life. Their rooms were simple. They used their own house as a public school, where a good number of young people are educated free of charge. They won't accept gifts of any kind from anybody. They began their community in the most absolute poverty. They were lacking even the necessities. But they were happy to continue their mission which God entrusted to them. The first community of Stimate managed to use the time properly. Time is a precious gift given by God. Every Christian and especially every consecrated person must divide the hours of the day in such a way that there is no time which is not well used. What you do with your life is your gift to God. We should follow Jesus in whatever we do, in our service to others and respecting others. From his life we can understand that there is no holiness without temptations and suffering. Great temptations are the way to reach great holiness. We have to possess his spirit and his sanctity in life. The first members of our congregation worked very hard just like

It was not in mind to become a priest or religious from the beginning. When I was child, before receiving first Holy Communion I told my parish priest that I wanted to become a priest so that he would be proud of me. After graduating in senior high school, I don't know where I should go to further my education. I want to become a teacher. I began to find high-quality universities to follow test but my parents would not allow because the school I chose is very expensive. Once the time in the senior high school my religious teacher recommended that I should apply in the seminary instead. Unable to decide, I hesitated because I do not know if I wanted to be a seminarian. It has not occurred to my mind even. When I went home for vacation one time, I met Brother Abdon, a seminarian. He was my senior in elementary school and we came from the same village. Hearing from him that he is a member

of a congregation and just opened a seminary in Indonesia, I became interested and decided to join him just for an experience.
