
Charity Works on Purpose: A recollection with Sr. Lakhana

Viva! St.Gaspar Bertoni



The Catholic Church assigns one date out of the year for each and every canonized saint — known as the saint's feast day. The saints are remembered on their individual feast days with special mention, prayers, and possibly a scripture reading. A saint's feast day can be the day of their actual death or a day assigned by the Church. Typically, the Church only assigns a day when the day of death is unknown or if several other saints are already assigned to that day. The number of canonized saints, however, is greater than the number of days in a calendar year. So two or more saints often share the same feast day. Because overlap often occurs, and the Church isn't sure of the date of death of some saints, other calendar dates are sometimes chosen — such as the day that the saint was canonized.

It was a nice Friday. The Stigmatine congregation and whole Christian believers around the world, celebrated the feast day of St. Gaspar Bertoni, priest and founder. St. Gaspar Bertoni was born on October 9, 1777 in Verona-Italy. He was a simple man and an example of great virtue to everybody. At 15 years of age, St. Gaspar started his philosophical studies. Notice in his notebooks the heading: L.D.S. and the sketches of the passion of Jesus with the blood flowing from his wounds. At 18 years of age, St. Gaspar started his theological courses in the seminary. On April 12, 1799, he was ordained as Deacon and a year after, on September 20, 1800, he was ordained as diocesan priest. On June 1802, he founded Marian Oratory and November 4, 1816, he founded Congregation of the Sacred Stigmata of Our Lord Jesus Christ. A year after, he was given a title "Apostolic Missionary" by pope Pius VII. St. Gaspar started his sickness on 1812 until the end of his earthly life and he was considering it as "School of Suffering". St. Gaspar Bertoni died on June 12, 1853 at the age of 75. He was canonized by Pope John Paul II on November 1, 1989.

For us, novitiate community, we began the feast day of the founder with novena that are said for nine straight days. In these days, we meditated upon the earthly life and the words of St. Gaspar Bertoni. And on the exact day, June 12, together with Phuket community, some sisters and parishioners we celebrated the mass in the community chapel. After the mass, we continued with our activities. And in the evening we had dinner together in the community house. During meal, the new profess brothers, presented a song and poem about the life of St. Gaspar Bertoni and after that we continued our meal and conversation as brothers in Christ and children of St. Gaspar Bertoni. 
